Can You Find It?

Join our scavenger hunt and find the location of this fine example of a bay window with overhang, brackets, and turned pendant. This type of decoration is characteristic of the Eastlake details found on many Queen Anne buildings, a style that was popular between 1880 and 1910, Charles Eastlake was a British interior and furniture designer whose creations were usually embellished with spindles, buttons, and carved details—similar to what you see here decorating this bay window. In Anacortes, several examples of this style of window—complete with their turned pendants—survive. This particular example has scalloped trim and decorative scroll work.



Location: 701 Q (corner of 7th and Q) – East side of building. Built c 1900.
